

TACKLING THE CAUSES AND CONSEQUENCES OF HOMELESSNESS

Duty of Candour is a legal requirement for care and social work providers to ensure that if something goes wrong, the people affected are offered an explanation, an apology and an assurance that staff will learn from the error.

We have a legal obligation, under The Duty of Candour Procedure (Scotland) Regulation 2018, to produce a short annual report showing the learning from our Duty of Candour incidents every financial year. The report must be published and notification given to the Care Inspectorate.
