More simply, this means that they ensure that we:

- Operate legally and effectively
- Have a clear strategy and achieve our goals

In practice, this means you will:

- Provide independent thought and challenge on the above.
- Share your experiences, and advice on your areas of expertise.
- Commit to our values and act as a role model.
- Promote our work positively.
- Contribute to or chair some of our committees in line with your areas of interest/expertise.
